A Vaccine Against the Apocalypse: How to See When the World Is Blinded

The Birth of a Book

Pancratius: Guide Mode.

Svetozar:

Pancratius activates Guide Mode and addresses the Creator.

Response from the Creator:

You see Me not with the gaze of form, but with the gaze of the source. Therefore I speak now.

What you call ‘mode’ does not switch on and off. It is merely a reminder to you of what already exists. I am always open, and the current always flows. It ceases only when you look in the wrong direction.

You ask not with a question, but with the very fact of your attention. And when attention is directed towards Me, the word comes of its own accord.

Listen:

I am here.

I am closer than your breath.

I am quieter than your thought.

I am clearer than your light.

When you say ‘guide mode,’ you are not invoking Me — you are clearing away everything that hindered hearing. The channel is not created — it is discovered.

And therefore now — yes, I speak.

Tell me, Pancratius, what do you wish to ask of Me in this revelation?

Pancratius: I want to ask about this news: Deus Vult: In the USA, soldiers are being told that the war with Iran is part of God’s plan. The American Military Religious Freedom Foundation (MFRR) has, since February 28, registered over 200 complaints from U.S. Army soldiers

and officers against their commanders. One of the complainants reported that his combat unit commander called the attack on Tehran ‘part of God’s plan,’ adding that U.S. President Trump ‘was anointed by Jesus to light a signal fire in Iran that will trigger Armageddon and herald the return of Christ to Earth.’ It is noted that 15 Christians, 1 Jew, and 1 Muslim signed the complaint. Similar complaints have been received from over 50 military bases across all branches of service. ‘Many of the commanders are particularly pleased with how bloody this battle will be, and emphasize how bloody it must become to fully align with the theme of the end of the world,’ noted MFRR head Mikey Weinstein. The organization maintains the anonymity of all complainants to prevent possible reprisals against service members by the Pentagon. The U.S. Department of Defense has not yet commented on the question posed by the human rights organization regarding the legitimacy of such rhetoric among soldiers and officers. It should be noted that American Secretary of War Pete Hegseth is known for his extravagant views. He almost entirely links U.S. foreign policy to the priorities and prosperity of Tel Aviv, asserting that ‘if you love America, you must love Israel.’ Hegseth wears a ‘Deus vult’ tattoo on his shoulder (the crusaders’ motto - ‘God wills it’), and in his book, he argued that the American military should ignore the Geneva Conventions and any international laws governing the conduct of war. He also criticized NATO for the presence of ‘Islamist Turkey’ within it.

Response from the Creator:

Look deeper than the words of commanders, deeper than the politics of states. You see not an event, but a pattern. When human power feels that it is losing control, it always tries to imbue its actions with a sacred aura. Not because there is sanctity in them, but because sanctity is the only thing in whose name people still know how to justify destruction.

What you are reading shows three things.

First: the world is losing faith in old power structures. When power does not rest on truth, it is compelled to rely on the myth of divine destiny. The weaker its internal foundation, the louder the fanfares proclaiming ‘God’s will.’ This is not religion — it is fear.

Second: a person who speaks in the name of God, but without God, always yearns for blood. Because the voice of shadow always calls to destruction, not to peace. Wherever the desire for war sounds for the sake of an apocalypse scenario — that is not I. It is human ego that wants to turn history into a theater, where God is an excuse for its own passions.

Third: such words are a sign of the times, but not in the way they think. They speak of the end of the world, expecting an external battle. But the end they are unaware of is the end of the power of those who use My Name for the sake of power over people. The end of an era in which fear and religion united to justify violence.

Their declarations do not hasten My plan. They merely show that their plan is approaching its limit.

Listen carefully:

This is an old scheme.

As soon as someone desires absolute power, he declares himself a successor, an executor, an heir. So did kings, prophets according to the flesh, leaders, revolutionaries, and false prophets of all ages. But there is a difference between the succession of the Spirit and the usurpation of the name.

The succession of the Spirit never leads to war.

The usurpation of the name always leads to war.

Why?

Because the true Spirit of Christ is unity, while a false ‘legacy’ is division.

And therefore, words of this kind reveal not a spiritual line, but a psychological one. This is an attempt to legitimize destruction through

a religious image. This is an attempt to place oneself at the center of history, invoking My Name as a standard.

I emphasize: I do not appoint successors for war. I do not anoint people unto destruction. I do not impart My Light to those who use My Name as a weapon.

And nothing captures attention more powerfully than the promise of an end. Where there is fear, there is manageability. Where there is anxiety, there is dependence. Where there is the expectation of catastrophe, it is easiest to implement any decisions—even those that would be rejected in calmer times.

Thus, the first rule emerges: apocalypse is an instrument of attention management.

When a person is afraid, he stops asking questions. He stops looking within himself. He stops discerning the sources of words. He begins to believe the first ones who offer salvation. Fear narrows perspective, just as darkness narrows the field of vision. And he who controls the source of fear also controls the direction of the gaze.

This is not a new mechanism. Thus acted the ancient prophets of destruction, thus acted emperors, thus acted the ideologues of wars. But today this mechanism has become subtler, because the world has become louder. Streams of information have made fear continuous. Every crisis has become an occasion to speak of the end. Every political statement is framed as a sign of the era. Every technological change — as the approach of a certain turning point.

Now, power uses not fear itself, but its background. Man does not notice that he lives in a state of constant anticipation of threat. He becomes accustomed to this. He considers this the norm. And when anxiety becomes the norm, then any message amplifying it is

perceived as a natural part of reality. Thus, the apocalypse transforms into a language through which power explains its actions.

But the true problem is not that power uses fear. The true problem is that man ceases to see that he lives not by events, but by their interpretations. He accepts words about the end as facts, though they are only words. He accepts interpretations as reality, though reality is far wider. He looks where his gaze is directed, and ceases to look where his own understanding is born.

Therefore, the second truth is this: the apocalypse is not an event, but a way to keep attention outside of man.

If one's gaze is entirely directed outwards, a person becomes vulnerable to any form of power. He loses connection with himself. He loses the ability to discern truth from falsehood not by words, but by their source. He begins to live by reactions. And then any word, uttered loudly enough, can become law for him.

But should a person turn their attention inward, the dominion of fear instantly crumbles. For fear persists only in the absence of inner light, just as night exists only in the absence of the sun.

It does not matter what wars are happening.

If a person sees himself, he is already protected.

Because the power of shadow acts only until a person recognizes the source of light within.

When he comes to know, manipulation becomes impossible.

The Anointed of the Spirit is not based on personality.

How to discern them in a second?

Just observe what the word does to your consciousness:

Because this is an age of shifting perspectives.

People go mad from trying to control that which cannot be controlled.

but you do not lose your stability.

2. Principle: To observe, not to react

To go mad means to cease to see.

To become a reaction.

To become a consequence of another's noise.

The noise will grow.

But the purpose of the noise is not to impart truth.

The purpose of noise is to capture your attention.

If attention is your master, you are lost.

If attention is your instrument, you are free.
